



# Charbonneau Membership Criteria, Responsibilities and Benefits

- Charbonneau draws members from all spheres of cancer research
- Charbonneau researchers may be either Full or Associate Members
- Decisions on Charbonneau membership will be made and approved by the Charbonneau
  Executive Committee and are subject to periodic review
- Charbonneau Members will exhibit professional behavior and ethical standards in the workplace

## **Full Members**

### **Eligibility**

- A major interest in cancer research (i.e., basic, clinical, health service, population health)
- · Academic or clinical appointment at the University of Calgary or Alberta Health Services

### **Benefits**

#### Full Members:

- Access to facilities and resources of the Institute
- Eligible for research space within Charbonneau
- Access to financial support for research and trainees
- Access to mentorship, career support and grant reviews
- Access to educational programs and support

### **Expectations and Responsibilities**

- A primary interest in cancer research with evidence of ongoing scholarship
- A primary interest in cancer education with evidence of continuing activity
- Contribute towards the research success of Charbonneau through:
  - o active research funding support and publications
  - o participation in Charbonneau internal grant review
  - o mentorship for fellow Charbonneau members
  - o participation on Charbonneau committees and working groups
- Contribute towards the education and training success of Charbonneau through:
  - o supervision and mentorship of students, fellows and other trainees
  - o teaching Charbonneau affiliated courses and programs
- Submit an annual academic report (ARO) to the Cumming School of Medicine
- Permit the Charbonneau Cancer Institute to extract metrics data from ARO
- Acknowledge Charbonneau in publications, abstracts and posters

## **Associate Members**

An academic appointment at a Canadian university; including adjunct, research, and emeritus

#### Criteria

- An interest in cancer research
- A researcher holding a primary appointment in another Institute or Faculty of the University
- External to the University of Calgary (must be sponsored by a Full Member of Charbonneau)

### **Benefits and Restrictions**

- Receive communications and invitations to seminars, special events and journal clubs
- Eligible for grant review support, mentorship and educational programs
- Ordinarily not eligible for Charbonneau funding, core services, or research space
